## Maintenance of Certification (MOC) Participation

Diplomates complete MOC requirements according to this schedule during each ten-year certification cycle. Diplomates who do not complete the requirements in the timeframes defined remain certified and will be listed as "not participating" in MOC on the **ABMS** website. The ABPM website lists only certification status, not MOC status. The requirements shown on this timeline are effective for diplomates recertifying in 2022 or later; please see the list of MOC Requirements by Year of Recertification for diplomates recertifying before 2022.

Please note this schedule may change to maintain consistency with ABMS requirements; the ABPM will notify all diplomates of any changes.
